

Here are a few tips for a successful garage sale:

- Be visible from the street. Put a sign or balloons in your yard if you are holding your sale at the back of your driveway or in your garage.
- Make items visible. Consider moving some items to your driveway, toward the front of your house.
- Hang clothes. Don't leave them in boxes.
- Price some items. It's not necessary to price every single item, but give shoppers an idea of what prices you expect so they aren't scared to ask.
- Save your used grocery sacks to bag up items shoppers buy.
- Have plenty of change and small denomination bills ready.
- Be prepared for early bird shoppers arriving at or before 8 AM!

#### Houston Selected Winner and the Fan Favorite in Bloomberg Philanthropies' Mayors Challenge

\$1 Million Prize Awarded for the City's Revolutionary One Bin for All Idea

Thanks to your support, Houston 's *One Bin for All* idea has been named one of the five winners in the Bloomberg Philanthropies' Mayors Challenge, a competition to inspire American cities to generate innovative ideas that solve major challenges and improve city life - and that ultimately can be shared with other cities to improve the well-being of the nation.

Houston will receive a \$1 million innovation prize to help implement its *One Bin for All* idea and as the winner of the Mayors Challenge Fan Favorite Selection, Houston will also receive a \$50K in-kind grant from IBM to support the implementation of its *One Bin For All* idea.

One Bin for All is a first-of-its kind innovation that will revolutionize the way the City of Houston handles trash, achieving high-volume recycling and waste diversion, reduced greenhouse gas emissions and lower operating costs. More information will be forthcoming as the program moves forward.

One Bin for All utilizes game-changing technology to separate trash from recyclables, allowing residents to discard all materials in one bin. The anticipated end result is a dramatic increase in the amount of waste diverted from our landfills. Implementation will be achieved through a public/private partnership.

#### What's Happening Around Houston? By Carol Jean Hebert

#### Miller Outdoor Theater

Since its beginnings 89 years ago, Miller Outdoor Theatre has provided a unique resource for the City of Houston and its visitors. Steadfast in the founding principal that the theatre shall provide cultural and educational events free of charge for the public, Miller has evolved like the city itself. What was once "a permanent bandstand" in Hermann Park is now a first-class proscenium theatre, professionally operated and committed to providing quality and diverse performances worthy of the great international city that Houston has become.

Located on nearly eight acres in the heart of Hermann Park, Miller Outdoor Theatre is the only free open-air theatre of its kind in the United States. It is a home away from home for some of Houston's most dynamic arts organizations such as HITS Theater, Houston Grand Opera, Dance of Asian America, Festival Chicano, Houston Symphony, Theatre Under The Stars (TUTS) and a host of other multi-cultural groups and theater companies. Every performance in its March to November season is free.

Miller's Hill" was created in 1948 with dirt from the excavations of Fannin Street. In 1968, the city built a new theatre with bonds approved by public vote. The new theatre building, designed by Eugene Werlin and Associates, won several awards: the *American Iron and Steel Institute's Biannual Award (1969)*, the *American Institute of Steel Construction's Award of Excellence*, and the *James E. Lincoln Arc Welding Foundation Award*. The 1968 Miller Theatre building was then refurbished starting in 1996, jointly funded by the city of Houston and Friends of Hermann Park.

For 90 years, Miller Outdoor Theatre has been a place where special memories are made: of squealing with delight while rolling down the hill--over and over again....of first dates and surprise proposals...of the Houston Symphony and fireworks on July 4th...of the first time to experience Shakespeare or an opera or mariachi or the music of Motown...of crowds of thousands simultaneously leaping to their feet to offer a standing ovation ...of sharing great performances with friends and family and total strangers...these are Miller memories. The stately oak trees on either side of the stage that flanked the original bandstand built when Miller opened in 1923 still stand sentry today. Miller Memorial Theatre, as it was originally called, looked a bit different back then, but one thing remains the same: audiences have never been charged admission for the quality and quantity of entertainment it provides.




#### **Shepherd Park Plaza Travelers**
