

A few helpful tips for a successful garage sale:

- \Rightarrow Make items visible. Consider moving some items to your driveway toward the front of your house.
- ⇒ Hang clothes instead of leaving them in boxes or folded on tables.
- ⇒ Price some items. It's not necessary to price every single item, but give shoppers an idea of what prices you expect so they aren't scared to ask.
- ⇒ Save your used grocery sacks to bag up items shoppers buy.


