#### WOMEN'S SAFETY PROGRAM - SIGN UP NOW!

Shepherd Park Plaza is a supporter of the Precinct 1 Constable program. One of the benefits of being a participant is that SPP female residents can participation in a free Rape Aggression Defense ("RAD") program. The RAD approach to personal safety begins with awareness, prevention, risk reduction and risk avoidance, and progresses to hands-on physical defense techniques designed especially for women. Participants in the program will learn a wide range of tactics to protect themselves if attacked. The practical techniques are designed to maximize the strengths of a woman's body and build upon existing instinctive responses to provide women with effective self-defense options.

This safety program is available to women age 14 and over. Women ages 14-17 must be accompanied by an adult. This is a 12-hour program that will be taught over four consecutive nights beginning August 10th from 6:00 p.m.-9:00 p.m. each night. The class is designed for 8 to 25 female participants and is open to residents who live in Shepherd Park Plaza and Candlelight Plaza. This training will take place at St. Stephen's United Methodist Church at 2003 W. 43rd Street. 

#### **Bubble Bread**

1 lb. bacon, fried and crumbled into bits

3 cans of plain biscuits (not buttermilk, butter or flaky type), cut into quarters

1/4 cup chopped green bell pepper

1/4 cup chopped white onions

1/4 cup parmesan cheese

1/2 cup melted butter

Optional: Chopped red bell pepper or chopped pimentos

In mixing bowl, combine all ingredients mixing lightly with a fork. Pour into greased bundt pan. Bake for 20 minutes at 400 degrees. Pull apart and serve hot.



# REMINDERS By: Chuck Blesener

Head-in parking is not permitted anywhere in our neighborhood. All vehicles must be parked parallel to the curb, facing in the direction of traffic, and wheels within 18 inches of the curb. It is always illegal to block a sidewalk, even in your own driveway.

It is a violation to place any signs on City property, light poles, traffic sign posts, or someone else's property without their permission. Our deed restrictions prohibit placing any signs on your property except ones advertising the property for sale. You never have to place a contractor's sign in your yard regardless of what the contractor tells you.

By city ordinance, no vehicles can be left on the street for more than 24 hours without being moved. No trailer can be left in the street for more than two hours, whether connected to a vehicle or not. All vehicles visible from the street must have current licenses and be in an operable condition or are considered an abandoned junk vehicle subject to towing.
