IMMEDIATELY AFTER WRITING THE REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER IN LAST MONTH'S PULSE, AND NOTING THAT IT HAD BEEN A low crime month, we began receiving reports of garage and vehicle burglaries, and thefts. Most of these were on the west end of our neighborhood, mainly Apollo and Cheshire. Some of these crimes ARE NOT LISTED IN THE STATISTICS ABOVE FROM THE CONSTABLE'S OFFICE BECAUSE RESIDENTS DID NOT REPORT them at all or reported to HPD only. We encourage you to report every crime to both HPD (911 or 713-884-3131) and to Constable Dispatch (713-755-7628). You can report your burglary or theft in social media, but it is also important to report these incidences to all area authorities.

### HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

As we approach the holidays and are busy with shopping, attending parties and dealing with traffic, some of us get distracted **about our own safety, so here's a few tips to follow during this busy time of year. Shop and park in well lit areas and take only the money and credit cards needed for your purchases.** Be observant and aware of your surroundings and have your car keys out and ready in the parking lot. Do not leave packages or valuables in plain sight in your vehicle. Be careful when decorating from ladders and keep all electrical connections watertight and people-proof. Keep blinds or curtains closed to not expose gifts and valuables to outsiders. Tear down discarded boxes so as not to advertise purchases of TV's or other valuable gift items. Limit on-street parking of guests and family to allow for the access of emergency vehicles. Don't drink and drive and discourage guests from drinking too much and driving home.

Ms. Wren titled her presentation “Relatively Unknown Observations from the Front Lines of Residential Landscape Design”. With that interesting title, her talk was very informative and eye-opening. Some thoughts she shared:

- Understand the drainage patterns, sun/shade tracking, clearances needed for mature plants and air flow in your yard before you create your garden. These are the ‘bones’; the rest is topping.
- Big trees, albeit gorgeous, are thirsty and selfish. Don’t put new, tender plantings under trees – they will always be straining for their share of water.
- Design your garden with ‘you’ in mind. Be sure it has personal meaning; you will enjoy it more.


