February—My, What Great Composting Weather We're Having! by Emily Leffler

I was so pleased to read SPP Resident **Dennis Woodward**'s recent article in *the Leader* about composting! Here here, Dennis. Thank you for writing so well about the benefits of composting. I agree whole-heartedly! I also wanted to offer another perspective on composting. It's good for lazy people like me. Why spend all that time and effort sweeping up all those leaves and pine needles and then bagging them up? All you have to do is rake them from the sidewalk or curbside into the nearby grass and then mow over them. In fact, the more spread out your leaves are, the easier it is on your mower. Once mowed, if your clippings have not already been mulched and redistributed by your mower (the ultimate solution!) you can just take the clippings bag off the mower and distribute the mulch in low-lying areas of your yard or spread over spots where grass is lacking. Be careful not to suffocate your grass—those blades need sunshine, too.

And bless my kitchen waste compost pile! Between it and our glorious 96-gallon recycle bin, my family of four only produces one to two bags of actual trash each week. I spread fruit and vegetable peels, rinds, stems, etc all through my flower beds to enrich the soil. In the summer, the squirrels love scavenging the pile for strawberry hulls. I kid you not, they actually leave the strawberry leaves (picked clean) in little rows on the stones bordering my beds. And here are some before and after shots of my autumn gourds and jack-o-lanterns, just to show how fast composting occurs.



Taken November 1. I had re-distributed all the Halloween decorations to the pile.



Taken January 14. Clearly the cut pumpkins went faster than the uncut gourds. I think I'll take a hoe to the pile this weekend to move things along.

I'm sure there are lots of other quick things I could do to improve my own composting efforts—like introducing worms to my pile—but for now, I'm happy with my simple efforts. Consider starting your own composting and talk to your neighbors about it. You might be surprised how many are already doing it!

Support SPP Safety Give to the Constable Program

The requested Constable Patrol contribution for the coming year is \$200 per household. With the recent increase in crime in our area, it's important that we deter potential criminals with the visibility and authority provided the Constable Program. We all benefit through a safer neighborhood, lower crime, and higher property values, and it's an investment worth making to keep SPP a wonderful and safe place to live!

What do you get for \$200? A full-time armed and uniformed deputy patrolling our neighborhood in a marked vehicle 40 hours per week. Officers from the Constable's patrol division make numerous sweeps of SPP when our deputy is not on duty. **Deputy James Moulden** is assigned to our neighborhood, and he is very dedicated and committed to keeping SPP safe. His work hours are set by the SPPCC board and are based on crime statistics for our neighborhood and the patrol hours of our Citizens Patrol. A great part of the time, our deputy is patrolling while we are fast asleep.

Can you contribute in installments? We realize that a lump sum payment may not be feasible for everyone, so you are welcome to contribute in installments. You may do so by mailing periodic payments or by making online payments as you are able. However, we are not able to send out reminders or more frequent bills, so you are asked to set up your own reminder system so that you can make your desired contributions in a timely manner. No donation is too small...even \$5 a month can make a difference!

GARDENING TIP OF THE MONTH

February brings Valentine's Day flowers! To dry these flowers for a permanent keepsake, place the cut flowers in a vase with the following mixture; 1 tablespoon sugar, 2 drops Clorox in 1 cup of water. Double the mixture as needed to make sure all stems are in mixture. Let the liquid completely evaporate, and the shape and color of your flowers will be preserved.
