2016 Fundraising Campaign Progress Report by Tom Dornak

The 2016 SPP Constable Program and Civic Club Dues Fundraising Campaign is in full swing. A second mailing went out on Jan 15th to non-members and to members who either have not participated or have only partially donated the requested donation of \$200 for the Constable Patrol Program. As of January 15th the percentage of 2016 SPP Civic Club Membership renewals is 54%. The percentage of Constable Patrol Program participants is 47%. Our goal is to increase levels of participation in both programs upwards to 75%.

We are on our second year of operating our Constable Patrol Program utilizing two deputy patrollers as opposed to one deputy patroller in the past. Last year many residents increased their level of donation to help with the extra funds needed to support this program. The Civic Club fundraising events like the Crawfish Boil and Wine Crawl also help with raising funds for this program, **however, we didn't fully meet the 2015 budget to sustain two patrollers. The** best way to meet budget is to get more residents to participate in our fundraising. Please keep in mind that as burglary and speeding is lower in our neighborhood versus other nearby neighborhoods without a Constable Program, many residents may take this for granted and may forget to participate. If you **haven't yet mailed in your donation, please do so today. And while the requested** amount for the Constable Patrol Program is \$200, we appreciate any amount of donation.

We will be holding a Couples Mixer in February. Please look for more details to come on the Plaza Moms Facebook and Big Tent pages.


Our next meeting will be on Monday, March 7th at Jamie Bartula's house, 1232 Thornton (just west of Ella).

STORM SEWER AND ROAD PAVING STORM PROJECTS

The contractor hired by the City to replace the sanitary sewer lines in our neighborhood is back under a new contract to finish what was not on the first contract. They are using the south end of Brinkman as a staging area for their work. A contractor for CenterPoint is still relocating gas lines in preparation for stormsewer and paving work.

After many delays, City Council awarded the construction contract for the upcoming Garden Oaks and Shepherd Park Capital Improvement Project (CIP) to Pierce Goodwin Alexander & Linville, Inc. This project will provide for the construction of storm drainage improvements, necessary concrete paving, and underground utilities for portions of the Garden Oaks, Shepherd Park Plaza, and Candlelight Plaza communities. Improvements will include modification of street conveyance and sheet flow and detention as needed for flood mitigation.

Be prepared for major construction in the area and possibly altering your normal driving routes.
