With another exciting Holiday season behind us, your SPP Civic Club is nearing the end of the principal part of its 2017 Membership and Constable Program support drive and desperately needs your participation.

SPP residents have historically shown outstanding neighborhood involvement and financial support for our voluntary Civic Club organization and Constable Program for neighborhood security. This year's support is no exception and we are on track to meet the financial goals needed to support both the ongoing operating expenses of our Civic Club and the contract obligations for our Constable Program.

It has always been the policy of your Civic Club to raise all the necessary funds to support our Constable Program in advance of entering into the contract renewal for the upcoming year. To accomplish that objective for the upcoming contract renewal we need (as of 12/31/2016) about 80 more residents to renew their financial support, or for any new residents to join their neighbors in supporting this valuable neighborhood service.

The requested donation for 2017 is \$250.00. Your support at that level, with the benefit or our partnership with Candlelight Plaza, allows us to contract for **two** licensed law enforcement officers committed to our two neighborhoods up to 80 hours per week.

If you are new to SPP, or have never supported our Constable Program, please help your neighbors support this valuable program. If you have supported the program in the past, thank you for your support and please renew. With HPD being stretched beyond its available resources, our Deputy Constable Program is an integral component, along with our Citizens Patrol, to our effort to maintain the security of our residents and property.

Hello Neighbors,

In addition to our monthly Constable report, we have also provided everyone with the statistics for all of 2016. In particular, I am very happy to see that 161 *suspicious persons/vehicles* CALLS WERE MADE TO THE CONSTABLE'S OFFICE. WE ALWAYS URGE EVERYONE TO CALL THE CONSTABLE IF YOU SEE ANYTHING SUSPICIOUS. LET'S ALL KEEP UP THE GOOD WORK! SPP will be a safer place if we look out for our neighbors.

Also notice that our deputies made 2,079 contract checks during the year and logged 46,982 miles in patrolling SPP and Candlelight Plaza. That works out to about 8 complete sweeps of our neighborhoods and 181 miles per 2 deputy shift. There are approximately 9.3 miles of pavement in our contract. To put that in perspective, that is the same distance as getting on Loop 610 at Durham and heading west all the way past I-10, THE GALLERIA, THE SOUTHWEST FREEWAY, AND THEN EXITING ON BELLAIRE BLVD. THAT'S A LOT of pavement to cover. Deputy Moul den and Deputy Hinkle are doing a great job.

Reminder — if you are a victim of a crime, call the Constable to report it even if you have reported it to HPD. Our deputies have an outstanding knowledge of our area and have solved numerous crimes. Be sure they know what is going on in SPP.

IF YOU HAVEN'T CONTRIBUTED TO THE CONSTABLE PATROL PROGRAM, PLEASE DO SO TODAY. WITH the budget problems of the City, there are fewer HPD officers avail able. We need the Constable Program. You can contribute either online or by mail.


CONSTABLE PROGRAM FUNDRAISING DRIVE

So.... Circling back to the Constable Program. In years past, our residents have been generous enough to voluntarily make a donation to the Constable Patrol Program. We've had as much as 70%+ participation, but right now we're running low. It seems like some of our newer residents have been hesitant to donate because they don't know much about the program. Some benefits of having a Constable patrol our neighborhood:

- 80 hours of patrolling per week in SPP and Candlelight Plaza.
- Vacation watch when traveling (must be requested).
- Increased patrolling for speeding violations to protect our residents, children and pets.
- ♦ Lower crime rates for SPP.
- ♦ The Constables can issue tickets, arrest suspects, investigate crimes and provide a presence that deters criminals in our neighborhood.
- The Constables can perform a check of your home (by appointment) to determine areas where you can improve the security of your family and property.

The program donations are voluntary. Participants and non-participants benefit from the Constables' presence in our neighborhood. Our longest standing Constable James Moulden often spends his time working to solve specific crimes after they've occurred, in *addition* to patrolling our area. He recently was instrumental in recovering a stolen pressure washer. In the past, he's been key to the return of stolen jewelry, stolen tools, stolen yard equipment and truck tailgates. Our taxes pay for protection by the Houston Police Department, however, in a city our size, it helps to have Peace Officers specifically assigned to our neighborhood.

Our goal is to raise \$108,600 for the 2017 Constable Patrol Program for 2 officers (shared with Candlelight Plaza). To date, we're a little over \$20,000 under that goal (see graph to the right). Approximately 47% of households in SPP are donating to this program! If just 20% of the non-participants would make a donation of \$250, we could meet our goal (See article on page 1 for more about residents needed to reach our goal). If 25% of the non-participants would donate \$200, we could be just slightly under our goal.



Thanks again to Deputy James Moulden for his long-time dedication to the safety of our

residents and their homes and property. Your vigilance, time, loyalty and bravery are all much appreciated!


HAY—WHAT A GREAT TURNOUT WE HAD!

CHANGE HABITS TO IMPROVE YOUR HEALTH

As the "new" in new year fades, so do many of our good intentions. Regardless of what your resolutions may have been, it's never too late to make small changes that can lead to big results.

Stay Strong – Strength helps us bounce back from illness or injury more easily. Strive for a balanced workout plan that includes strength, cardio, and flexibility training.

Grab a Glass - Drinking water can boost overall health, energy and weight loss. Increase your fluid intake to boost your metabolism.

Get More Sleep - Skipping sleep can speed up aging and slow down weight loss. Get a minimum of seven hours each night to keep your body running right.

Start with Breakfast - Skipping the first meal of the day can increase risk for obesity more than fourfold. Begin the day with healthy fuel for your optimum function.

Maintain a Balance – Eating a good variety of foods is the best diet you can have. Minimize simple carbohydrates and sugars and load up on healthy fruits and vegetables.

Focus on Nutrients not Calories - While the amount of calories you consume is crucial for weight loss, the quality of your food is often more important. Losing weight isn't all about cutting calories. Focus on the foods most associated with shedding pounds like yogurt, nuts, whole grains, fruits, and vegetables. Avoid processed foods, chips, fries, sodas, and sweets.

Every Step Counts – Whether you walk, run or engage in other exercise, getting up and moving is a great way to reach your fitness goals. Think outside the box and go for a hike in a park or on a nature trail. Throw Frisbee or football with the kids or weed that flower bed or go bowling. Maybe try rock climbing. A variety of activities will keep you from getting bored. Get a partner so you can keep each other motivated.



Prevent Problems – Getting regular medical check-ups and knowing your hereditary risk factors can help prevent bigger health problems.

Get Your Daily Dose of D - New research says that vitamin D may play a crucial role in weight loss by controlling appetite and helping fat cells become more metabolically active. The sunshine vitamin also helps your body better absorb bone-boosting calcium, improves immunity, reduces inflammation, and may even protect against some forms of cancer.

Nearly 75 percent of Americans are vitamin-D deficient. The best sources [of vitamin D] are salmon, tuna, and mackerel but fish liver oils, beef liver, cheese, and egg yolks also contain small amounts. And don't forget the most convenient source of all - sunlight.

Tips at your Fingertips – Check out the numerous phone apps that make exercise fun and provide goals and tracking tools. Some have healthy eating tips and calorie counters. You can even sync results with an exercise partner.

Journey to Wildlife Certification of Our Yard By: Cynthia Wolfram

Remember Hurricane Ike?? Following the hurricane, our journey to change the landscape began after the damage to the plants during the storm. Upon reflecting on the opportunity to change the yard, we researched the options of how to certify our yard with the National Wildlife Federation. The process was multi-year with intentional selection of plants to ensure the yard provided shelter, food, water and sustainable practices for the wildlife. Certification provides opportunity to contribute to the movement of people making changes in their yards and gardens to support wildlife, making my yard better for wildlife. The planning, landscaping and sustainable gardening provides quality habitat – food, water, cover and places to raise their young.

The basic considerations are:

F

Food: seeds, suet, berries, fruits, nuts and feeders for wildlife. Many of these can be provided naturally in the yard throughout the year with plant selections.

Water: Birdbath, water pond, butterfly puddling area are water options. Cover: Ground covers, evergreen plants, rock pile, and wooded areas.

Raising young: Host plants to caterpillars, mature trees, dense shrubs.

Feel free to visit our yard. We always have plants and experiences to share as we are always changing and developing our yard.
