Some Notes About Deed Restrictions and Architectural Guidelines

As I begin to take down the Christmas lights from the eaves of my roof, I notice that the paint is in pretty rough shape. Hmmm... might be time to get the house re-painted. Since this is a change to the exterior of my home, it's time to call one of the nicest neighbors in SPP, Darryl Rickaway. Darryl is our current Civic Club Committee Chair for Deed Restrictions and Architectural Guidelines. Any time neighbors make changes to the exterior of the home, we need to give Darryl a ring to check in. Here are some facts about this matter:

- Some residents have asked whether our **Deed Restrictions** have expired—they have not. All four sections of Shepherd Park Plaza have a renewal clause in the deed restrictions, so our deed restrictions are automatically renewed for successive ten year periods indefinitely, unless a majority of property owners in each section petition and vote to change them. Our deed restrictions are currently valid, and enforceable.
- The Architectural Guidelines Committee assigned by the developers of Shepherd Park Plaza, and listed in the deed restrictions, has expired. However, the Civic Club Board created and maintains an Architectural Guidelines Committee duly elected by the members serving the same purpose.
- Get a permit! It is necessary for any resident that is remodeling, reroofing, making additions or any exterior changes to their home, to get a City of Houston building permit. When applying for the permit, the owner must sign a notarized Deed Restriction Affidavit swearing they are aware of all applicable restrictions and the plans are in full compliance with them. Submitting your plans in advance to the SPP Architectural Control Committee, and getting their approval, will make the process much easier. Without this approval you may be falsifying a legal document which could result in application denial, or the City could force you to remove the completed work.
- An Exception! While our deed restrictions specify wood shingles or a built up roof, state law has for many years outlawed the enforcement of such restrictions for fire safety reasons. Your civic club has previously sent out copies of our deed restrictions with a cover letter recommending the use of architectural grade shingles in earth tone colors. You or your roofing company should submit the shingle and color of your choice for approval by the Architectural Control Committee.

Time to Take Down the Tree? Please Recycle!



Please recycle your tree! Here are two ways:

Easy: Put your tree curbside on Thursday, January 16 for Heavy Trash—TREE Waste Pickup. Trees picked up this day will automatically be recycled.

Fast: Take your tree to any City of Houston Solid Waste Depository through January 8 (locations found online at http://www.houstontx.gov/solidwaste/christmastree_recycling.html)

Be sure to remove all decorations, lights and tinsel. Flocked trees are not recyclable.

Recycled Christmas trees are ground into mulch that is available in bulk directly from Living Earth or available in bags at Houston retailers.

On Saturday, November 30, long time resident Bess Moseley was surprised with a birthday party to celebrate her upcoming 90th birthday.


