Calling all Shepherd Park and Candlelight Plaza neighbors! Pull out your stars, flags and red, white and blue! Led by a fire truck and escorted by our neighborhood constable, the parade starts at 9 am at the corner of Bethlehem and Apollo. How can I participate?

- We encourage our bikers and faster vehicle participants to arrive at Bethlehem and Apollo a bit before 9 am to wait for the fire truck. Be ready to pedal, because no matter how slowly we tell the fire chief to drive, he's just not used to parade pace!

A large bat colony lives under the bridge, and emerges at dusk each night. The emergence can be seen from the bike trail along White Oak Bayou. SPP Neighbor Jeanette Blesener reports the following, "We took lawn chairs and sat on the east edge of the bayou about 20 ft. from the end of the bridge. About 15-20 minutes after sunset, the lights came on for the hike/bike trail and the bats began to emerge. A large cloud of bats flew out and was silhouetted against the western sky. We stayed and stragglers flew very close to where we were sitting."

Parking is allowed on T. C. Jester. Jeanette also advises bringing a flashlight for the walk back to the car. Thanks for the tips, Jeanette!

#### What's Happening Around Houston—Old Seabrook

Seabrook is a small town on the Texas coast just 30 minutes south of downtown Houston. Residents and visitors treasure this vibrant community for its resort-style experiences that encompasses Clear Lake and Galveston Bay.

Seabrook celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2011. However, historic records date back to 1832 when Ritson Morris, a native Virginian, obtained a league of land from the Mexican government. A portion of the land was purchased by Seabrook W. Sydnor in 1895 and a plat was filed with the Harris County Courthouse the following year.



In March 1903, the Seabrook Company of Houston filed a revised layout of the proposed Seabrook town site, which appealed to local farmers, fishermen and merchants. Some years later, in 1961, local leaders had the city incorporated.

In 1964, a bridge was built between Kemah and Seabrook and State Highway 146 was established as a four-lane highway. In 1986, the decision was finally made to start the construction of a fixed span bridge that was tall enough for sailboats to pass under. After this bridge was finished, Highway 146 was linked all the way from Galveston to Texas State Highway 225. This resulted in an increase in the population of Seabrook to its present level of approximately 12,000 people.

Old Seabrook is a must see. Rich in history, Old Seabrook has an array of unique shops, fine dining and cozy bed and breakfast style lodging. Seabrook is conveniently located just minutes from several bay area attractions including the Kemah Boardwalk and NASA Space Center.

Seabrook parks cover over 100 acres and include two boat ramps, two public pools plus a 1,000-foot salt water fishing pier. Additionally, Seabrook has an extensive hike and bike trail system. The trail system connects several Seabrook parks and is perfect for those who enjoy nature.

The 1,000 foot fishing pier can be found at Pine Gulley Park. Pine Gulley is more than fifty acres and this park encompasses a Karankawa Indian camp site, wetlands, wooded area and nature trails. The park has several amenities such as restrooms, picnic tables, barbeque grills and playgrounds.


Seabrook is a bird lovers' paradise. Approximately three hundred diverse species, including several varieties of pelicans, ospreys, waxwings, warblers, sandpipers, buntings and many migrant songbirds visit throughout the year.

The Lakewood Yacht Club in Seabrook, offers a sailing school and charters. Classes and charters are available daily, overnight and on weekends which include classes for children and dinner cruises. Houston Party Boats and The Spirit of the

Texas Paddle Wheeler are located in Seabrook just inside the marina on Nasa Parkway.

Seabrook is known for its fish markets on Waterfront Drive where resident shrimpers and fishermen bring in their catches daily.

For a relaxing, back to nature and on the water day, you just might want to visit Seabrook!
