HAPPY 25th ANNIVERSARY FOR THE CITIZENS PATROL GROUP!

Congratulations to the Citizens Patrol Group on 25 years of actively patrolling Shepherd Park Plaza. Just over 25 years ago, our neighborhood was experiencing nearly a break-in/burglary per DAY. That's a huge number of personal lives impacted by the theft of our residents' homes. It was this staggering statistic that led Don Blaise and others to coordinate efforts with Houston Police Department to form a neighborhood watch group for SPP. Many residents signed up, went to training and starting driving, walking or biking our streets trying to deter would-be criminals. In a very short time, the Patrol helped reduce the number of burglaries by nearly 70%! Once again, our neighborhood became a safe, secure place to live. Some of these original Patrollers still patrol today! Then in 2000, the Constable Program was implemented; and the combination of these two groups has kept crime in SPP to a very low level.

Fast forward 25 years and imagine the need for this program to continue. But imagine also that it's suffering from a lack of new patrollers. Our neighborhood today is safer because of these patrollers and the Constable's presence here. If our patrol numbers continue to decline, it's possible that crime numbers will rise. Don't let that happen! Please get involved. Please volunteer. Please participate. Are you already out and about in our neighborhood and carry your cell phone with you? You're halfway there to becoming a Citizens Patrol member. Complete an application and go to a 1-hour training session and you're in! TRASHY CONDITIONS NEAR ALBA AND CHAMBOARD

It has become a frequent eyesore near the corner of Alba and Chamboard where people are leaving their trash and tree trimmings. This is near one of our neighborhood entrances and near the lovely Community Garden that the Galianos and others work so hard to maintain. One of the challenges is that this site is the dividing line between Garden Oaks and Shepherd Park Plaza, and these two neighborhoods have different heavy trash days.

If you are leaving your trash here, please know that it's illegal to leave trash at this location, not to mention unsightly. Please also remind your yard maintenance crews and renovation crews not to use this location to leave tree trimmings, grass, wood, debris or other trash. The Civic Club has notified the deputies to be on the lookout for the guilty parties participating in this illegal dumping. It has also been reported to the City of Houston on several occasions.




SHEPHERD PARK PLAZA CITIZENS PATROL WELCOMES VOLUNTEERS! YOU CAN SIGN UP TODAY

Because of changes in how patrolling is being done, our Citizen's Patrol Group no longer has a help line or the capability to handle house watches or vacation watches. This function is better done by our Constable's Deputies. To have your home placed on a watch list you can go online to http://pct1constable.net/sign-up/vacation-watch/ and enter the information. You can also use this site to sign up for email alerts from the Constable's office. If you do not have a computer or online capability, there are a few paper copies of the required form in the Citizen's Patrol box on the porch at 1010 Richelieu. The paper copy must be faxed or mailed at least one week before the requested watch date. Stay tuned for updates to our website for links to the vacation watch set-up.

PROTECTING YOUR PROPERTY

We recently had a rash of night-time thefts from porches and yards in our neighborhood. Deputy James Moulden was able to get a copy of a video from a neighbor that showed the thief and his vehicle. In showing it to others, one of the Garden Oaks deputies recognized the individual resulting in his arrest and the arrest of two more thieves. Our deputies work hard to not only try and prevent crime but also solve it when it happens.

You can help them help us by doing a few important things. Many homes now have cameras for security reasons. When a crime is committed near your home and your camera has captured video of the criminal, please make a copy of that video available to our deputies in their investigation. Make it as difficult as possible for a thief to steal your property. All outdoor items should be marked with your name and/or your address to make it hard to sell, and easier for you to later identify your property. Make every attempt to lock down your property with chains, cables, locks, and/or bolts. Yes this should not be necessary but it is. Take pictures of your property and record serial numbers and any other identifying information.

RECYCLING CHANGES

Houston City Council authorized a contract with Waste Management to ensure that **the single-stream recycling program will continue in Houston**. The new agreement saves the City \$2 million over the two-year period from the previously proposed contract and allows the flexibility of renegotiation on a shorter timeframe. As a compromise, over the next two years, glass will not be accepted at curbside in the green recycle containers. In the meantime, the City of Houston will continue to collect glass from **neighborhood recycling centers**, including the one at 9003 North Main Street, just north of Crosstimbers. **Do not put glass in your green recycling bin.**

The COH GREEN recycling bins are to be used for paper, cardboard, clean aluminum and tin cans, and plastics #1-6. They are not to be used for garbage, yard trimmings, leaves, electronics, glass, styrofoam, motor oil, or contaminated food containers. No pizza boxes! Boxes, plastic bottles, and cans that have food residue on them and are not clean, have to be sorted out and are thrown in the landfill anyway. Rinse them out or throw them in the garbage container. Do not place recyclables in plastic bags. It slows down the automated process and will just kick them out and put them in the trash. Our taxes are kept lower by allowing the COH Solid Waste Department to sell recyclable materials. The buyers will refuse an entire load when a few contaminated or unusable items are in the mix. Do recycle but be a good neighbor and do it properly.
