


#### **SPP MEN'S GROUP**



#### SPEED CUSHIONS By: Chuck Blesener

The City of Houston has issued the final draft for the speed cushions to be placed on our area streets. The original plan laid out by the city based on traffic studies was changed based on resident input—the red X's indicate speed cushions that have been deleted and the red rectangle is an added cushion. Unlike the rubber speed cushions to be placed in our neighborhood, the 12 cushions to be placed on the streets between Brinkman and N. Shepherd will be traditional raised asphalt speed bumps. The City has approved the final draft. contract was awarded Infrastructure Services Inc. Project funds will come from Council member Cohen's office. Hopefully these speed control devices will slow speeds and discourage cut-through traffic.

#### PLAN HOUSTON By: Chuck Blesener

Around October 14<sup>th</sup>, the city is rolling out Plan Houston, the first strategic plan with 12 core strategies and plans. This budget plan funding initiative is based on input from citizens on their perceived needs by ZIP code. This is a change from previous plans in which city department heads met to decide budgets and priorities. There will be an intense media campaign to get all residents involved. Participation is encouraged by everyone before the closing date of the survey on November 30<sup>th</sup>. The City will conduct an ongoing survey annually. Years ago many SPP residents complained about trick or treaters showing up late at night. As a response to those complaints the SPP Board developed a program that put some "organization" into the Halloween holiday for trick or treating. That program, described below, is one which the Board feels is fair to all involved and will make the holiday go more smoothly. Your cooperation is encouraged and greatly appreciated.

- 1. Large signs will be posted at the entrances to SPP requesting trick or treaters to follow some basic safety rules, which are to trick or treat between 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. only and to go only to houses which are well lit.
- 2. If trick or treaters are welcome to come to your home, please light up your house. Remember that it will be getting dark around 6:00 p.m.
- 3. If you choose not to participate in having trick or treating, you may want to turn off your porch light.
- 4. For your safety, remove "valuables" from the front of your home.
- 5. For the children's safety, if you are driving in the neighborhood, be aware that some very excited children will be running about...drive slowly and cautiously.
- 6. It is highly recommended that you do not park vehicles on the street on the night of Halloween. They make it difficult to see children crossing the street and the vehicle will be a lot safer parked in your garage or driveway.
- 7. Plan to end your activities at 8:00 p.m. Please turn off your lights at 8:00 p.m. Our Deputy Constables will be on duty. Call 713-755-7628 if you have problems.

# SHEPHERD PARK PLAZA CITIZENS PATROL WELCOMES VOLUNTEERS! YOU CAN SIGN UP TODAY

The Houston Police Department is concerned about crime in the neighborhoods and communities throughout the city. In response, the Citizen Patrol Program was established in an effort to bring the citizens and the police department together for a common goal, and that is to improve the quality of life by eliminating crime. You can become a respected volunteer by signing up today!

The Citizen Patrol Program is designed to provide a means for citizens to organize into patrol groups for the purpose of reducing crime in their community. Citizen Patrollers are the additional eyes and ears the police can count on to make Houston a safe place to live and work. The value of police/citizen cooperation is well illustrated by the success of the Citizen Patrol Program nationwide.

Training for Citizen Patrol certification is the second Tuesday of each month at 9455 West Montgomery at 7:00 p.m. Anyone in the neighborhood is invited to join the COP group. More eyes on our neighborhood means more awareness of suspicious activity. The applications must be sent in one week prior to the training.

#### **RIGHT-OF-WAY MAINTENANCE**

A City Ordinance requires homeowners to maintain the sidewalks and curbs in front of their homes as well as the grassy areas between the sidewalk and curb. The homeowner is also responsible for weeds and grass up to 14 feet past their property line in the back yard even if there is a fence and/or sidewalk behind their house. City of Houston Code of Ordinances, Article IX, Section 10-451 B (10) states -

"Property owners are responsible for all lots or parcels adjacent to and extending beyond the property line to the curb line of adjacent streets, where a curb line has been established, and 14 feet beyond the property line where no curb line has been established on adjacent streets, and also to the center of adjacent alleys."

#### MAJOR CONSTRUCTION STARTED

After waiting 10 years, the City has finally funded and awarded the construction project to improve area drainage and paving. Phase I of the \$19+ million contract was awarded to JFT Construction and work has begun on the downstream end at Alba and Judiway. Drainage improvements will affect an area from Shepherd to Ella and Pinemont to Loop 610. Construction began in October and is expected to end in early July 2018. To alleviate flooding and use underground water detention, the contractor will place massive storm drains down the middle of Alba, Chambord, and Brinkman. This slow process is expected to cause brief utility outages, road closures and detours, driveway and sidewalk blockages, and severe traffic increases. Roadway, sidewalk, and street lighting improvements will be made along the route. It may be necessary to change your driving patterns during the construction if possible. There will be times when residents will not be able to use their driveways.

Anticipated dates and locations affecting SPP are:

Phase I - North on Alba to Chamboard from October 2016-November 2017.

Phase IV – Chamboard from Alba to Brinkman from September 2017-February 2018.

Phases V & VI – Brinkman along Durham Elementary from January-July 2018.

The City Public Works and Engineering Department and the contractor will try and keep affected homeowners informed. Those along the route will receive door hangers with info and numbers to call with problems.. The yard flags and painted markings on curbs and streets should not be removed. Some trees will be removed or replaced where possible. Some landscaping near the street will be displaced. Residents should take photos of everything, including operating sprinkler systems, before construction begins. We will all be inconvenienced for the next two years but it should be worth it if the result is better drainage, less flooding, and better streets.

#### HIGH SPEED RAIL UPDATE

Several members of our Central Northwest Super Neighborhood Council make regular monthly meetings with multiple governmental agencies on the high speed rail project. Texas Central Railway completed the feasibility studies and public input meetings and is currently waiting on the Federal Railroad Administration for their Draft Environmental Impact Statement. After that there will be another comment period before the final environmental impact statement is issued. Multiple lawsuits over the eminent domain issue are ongoing. The City of Houston and Metro are still insisting that the high speed rail go into downtown on the I-10 median even though the engineers have said the turns are too sharp to make that work. The Houston High Speed Rail Watch group has come up with an alternative plan which would terminate the line at the Northwest Transit Center near I-10 and Loop 610. There they have plenty of parking and established bus routes. They would then extend the Metro green or purple routes of commuter rail to that location via elevated tracks down I-10 on existing HOV lanes. Watch for more on this unfolding event.

#### SIGN UP FOR EMERGENCY ALERTS

The active shooter situation that occurred recently in West University demonstrates the importance of receiving real-time informational updates when emergencies occur. Houstonians are encouraged to sign up for AlertHouston, the City of Houston's email emergency notification system, as well as for the regional Greater Harris County 9-1-1 Emergency Notification System, which allows public safety agencies throughout Harris and Fort Bend counties to send automatic notifications to telephones about local area emergencies. ## Tailgate Thefts on the Rise by: Bill Scheel

SPP, along with the surrounding neighborhoods, have experienced an increase in tailgate thefts. First of all, if you see <u>anyone</u> suspicious, call the Constable right away.

There are a few things you can do to protect your tailgate. It's true that most trucks are now equipped with a keyed lock at the handle on the tailgate. The ideal solution to prevent tailgate theft would be to simply keep this locked. If your truck doesn't come equipped with one, you can buy a tailgate lock as an anti-theft solution. It's a simple and effective and you don't have to constantly be worried about forgetting to secure it! After a quick look on Amazon, I found several tailgate locks that ranged from around \$15 to \$30.

There a couple of other things you can do. Park with the rear of your vehicle backed up close to your residence or garage to prevent the tailgate from being able to be let down. Also, you can engrave your VIN (vehicle identification number) into your tailgate. It should be visible but not to the point that it becomes an eye sore or is aesthetically unpleasing. Thieves avoid certain truck models because the VIN is factory engraved on the tailgate. Check to see if yours is one of those.


