2014 SPP Civic Club Fundraising Campaign has Begun

By now, you have received a mailed letter and statement kicking off the **2014 SPP Civic Club Fundraising** for both Civic Club Membership and the Constable Patrol Program. The 2014 campaign runs from September 1, 2013 through August 31, 2014, and while donations are received all year long, we request your prompt reply as our 2014 contract with Harris County for our Deputy Patroller must be signed and executed in December.

While participation in each program is voluntary, the neighborhood has historically seen strong participation, which is evident in the care our neighbors take in our properties and our neighbors and friends around us. We urge neighbors to participate as your continuous support helps maintain successful operations.

Membership dues are \$25 per year. The requested donation to the Constable Patrol Program is \$200 per household.

Here are a few tips for a successful garage sale:

- Be visible from the street. Put a sign or balloons in your yard if you are holding your sale at the back of your driveway or in your garage.
- Make items visible. Consider moving some items to your driveway, toward the front of your house.
- Hang clothes instead of leaving them in boxes or folded on tables.
- Price some items. It is not necessary to price every single item, but give shoppers an idea of what prices you expect so they aren't scared to ask.
- Save your used grocery sacks to bag up items shoppers buy.
- Have plenty of change and small denominations ready.
- Be prepared for early bird shoppers arriving at or before 8 AM!
