



UTILITY CONTRACTORS IN SPP

The City of Houston has hired a contractor to replace the sanitary sewer lines in our neighborhood. Previous contractors using cameras in the sewers determined that many of the existing concrete sewer lines were caving in. They were using Shepherd Park as a staging area but the COH Parks Department made them move. They have equipment all over the neighborhood and are making a lot of noise with the track-hoes and pulling machines. They use a cable through the old pipe to simultaneously pulverize the old pipe and pull in the new pipe. They are replacing the existing eight inch concrete pipe with ten inch thick-walled plastic pipe, except where there are twenty or more homes on a line and then they are using twelve inch pipe. They are using twelve inch pipe on the lateral lines running north and south where they are having to dig large holes in corner yards to keep the lines separated from the new water mains installed a couple of years ago. They can only pull in a limited amount of pipe at a time because it disables your sewer line when they do. It is necessary for them to enter most back yards to dig a hole and reconnect your home sewer line to the new pipe.

Some residents are unhappy with the contractor having to take down fences and dig up landscaping and shrubbery. Remember there is a ten foot utility easement running down each block - five feet on each side of the property line. City ordinance prohibits building any permanent structures on these easements and all fences and landscaping were placed with the knowledge that they may be removed by the city, utilities, or their contractors. Where there is a swimming pool in the back yard, they dig the hole by hand and not with their heavy equipment. They are replanting grass where necessary and restoring fences and landscaping to their original condition as much as possible.

Yard of the Month

Carolyn Long-1163 Chamboard

"My landscaping theme, which works perfectly in our climate, is to walk a bit on the wild side. There are so many fantastic native plants that not only feed the birds and butterflies, but also require less water. The hummingbird show that started around the end of August is in full swing. I have several feeders and use a home made nectar, 1:4 sugar to water, that I bring to a boil and store in the refrigerator. It's important not to let the feeders get moldy so I wash them with soapy water every week and every couple of weeks soak them in a bleach solution - 1/4 C to 1 gal water and rinse well."


