





Dear Neighbor,

On August 17th, KHOU Channel 11 aired a report about increased crime in the Oak Forest area. The HOA in Oak Forest has hired a private security firm to patrol the neighborhood but has cut back recently due to a lack of funds. Less than 20% of the Oak Forest residents contribute to the patrol fund. Part of the reason that homeowners expressed a reluctance to participate is that the private security firm does not have law enforcement powers.

That is not the case with our SPP Constable Patrol Program. Our program is manned by uniformed Deputy Constables from Precinct One and they have full police authority which includes the power of arrest and investigation. They patrol our neighborhood 80 hours per week in marked patrol cars.

Your SPP Board began the Constable Patrol Program in late 1999. Since its inception, the crime rate in SPP has gone down. It is a rare thing to receive the coverage that we do for only \$250 per year. Our current participation rate is 61% but we can do better. The more contract members we have the cheaper the cost will be for all of us. Our membership statistics show that our newer residents don't participate in the program as much as those who have been here a while. Let's all do our part no matter how long we have lived in SPP.

Is 96 cents a day too much to ask for the peace of mind that comes with knowing that a law enforcement officer is only minutes away? You have seen the reports about how stretched HPD resources are. By having our Patrol Program, we are insured of quick response and help in an emergency as well as having our homes watched while we are away.

If you can't give the full \$250, give what you can. We need all of our residents to be willing to pull the wagon and not just be passengers. You can even use a credit card to pay your Constable Program and SPP Civic Club dues. Go to http://shepherdparkplaza.com/ and click the pay constable and membership dues at the top.
