Letters will be mailed in mid-September kicking off the 2013 fundraising for both Civic Club Membership Dues and Constable Patrol Program. This is the second year for combining the fundraising campaign for these 2 programs. Membership dues will remain at \$25 per year and the Constable Patrol Program will remain to be \$200 per year. Both the membership to the Civic Club as well as the Constable Patrol Program is voluntary, though we urge your continuous support to maintain the successful operations. Your prompt reply is also needed as our 2013 contract with Harris County for our Contract Deputy Patroller must be signed and executed in December.

With some confusion in raising funds for the various programs, some residents may have already submitted their 2013 Dues and/or Deputy Constable Program donation. # So How Strong is Our Membership?

The Civic Club Board is pleased to publish our strong membership statistics. Frankly, our participation by our residents is unparalleled by our neighboring subdivisions with voluntary membership programs. I suspect our voluntary participation rates are the highest percentage throughout Houston. Participation is high in both Membership and Constable Patrol Program. Below are the membership statistics for paid membership dues and participation in the constable patrol program for the last 4 years.

### **Around Houston** by Carol Jean Hebert

#### Stark Museum of Art

The Stark Museum of Art in Orange, Texas, began as a vision of H.J. Lutcher Stark. As early as 1927 H.J. Lutcher Stark had discussed with associates his hope of someday opening a museum. His interest in the arts followed that of his mother, Miriam Lutcher Stark, an enthusiastic collector of art, furniture, and decorative items from around the world. Lutcher Stark developed a similar passion for collecting, with a particular interest in nature and art depicting the American West.

Lutcher Stark began building his collection as an undergraduate at the University of Texas, when he started purchasing works from Texas artists. In the late 1920s and early 1930s, he began collecting American Indian objects from New Mexico.

He married Nelda Childers in 1943, and together they continued to build the collection. From 1944 to 1962 they traveled annually to their ranch in Colorado, stopping along the way in Santa Fe and Taos, New Mexico, to meet with artists. From these visits they built a collection that strongly represents the Taos Society of Artists, a colony of artists drawn to the area for its scenery and culture.

In the 1950s, they expanded the collection with the rare five-volume set of John James Audubon's Birds of America as well as letters and first edition copies of publications by Audubon and John Woodhouse Audubon. In that same decade, they collected porcelain birds and flowers by Dorothy Doughty and Edward M. Boehm as well as a series of Steuben Glass pieces, including the complete set of The United States in Crystal. In the late 1950s, the Starks added 230 works by Paul Kane, which was their last major purchase for the collection.

Inspired by their shared passion, Nelda and Lutcher Stark founded the Nelda C. and H.J. Lutcher Stark Foundation in 1961 to enrich the quality of life in Southeast Texas through education and the arts. Although Lutcher Stark had envisioned a museum in his hometown of Orange, Texas, he did not live to see it accomplished. Upon his death in 1965, the majority of the art collection in Lutcher Stark's Estate passed to the Foundation. Under Nelda C. Stark's direction, the Foundation built the Stark Museum of Art, which opened on November 29, 1978. The Foundation continues today to acquire additional works of art for the collections.

The Stark Museum of Art houses one of the finest collections of 19th and 20th century Western American art and artifacts in the country. The collection focuses on the stunning land, dramatic people, and diverse wildlife of the American West. The Museum also holds a significant collection of American Indian art as well as collections of glass and porcelain, and rare books and manuscripts.

### Here are a few tips for a successful garage sale:

- Be visible from the street. Put a sign or balloon in your yard if you're holding your sale at the back of your driveway or in your garage.
- Make items visible. Consider moving some items to your driveway, toward the front of your house.
- Hang clothes. Don't leave them in cardboard boxes.
- Price some items. It's not necessary to price every single item, but give shoppers an idea of what prices you expect so they aren't scared to ask.
- Save your used grocery sacks to bag up items shopper buy.
- Have plenty of change and small denomination bills ready.

For residents wanting to donate unsold items, a nonprofit organization providing assistance to the needy in our part of Houston, MANNA (Ministry Assistance of the Near Northwest Alliance), located on 43rd at Rosslyn Rd will pick up your unwanted items beginning at 1pm.

### **CRIME REPORT** By Chuck Blesener

HPD Police Chief Charles McClelland Jr. says that crime in Houston is down 11% from last year despite the public's perception that it is higher. HPD is also changing the colors of their police cars from blue and white to black and white. It will cost \$60,000 in drug forfeiture money to paint the first 100 cars. It may take two years to change out the whole fleet of 1600 cars. Since Ford no longer makes the Crown Victoria, all new police cars will be either Ford Police Intercepters, Dodge Chargers, Chevy Caprices, or Chevy Tahoes. Officers uniforms may also change to black or dark blue to enable them to wear their bullet-proof vests on the outside. For the next two years you may see a variety of police vehicles and uniforms on the streets. You must stop for an officer but if in doubt as to whether they are really a police officer, drive to a fire station, police station, or a well lit occupied business.

North Division Captain Tom Runyan tells about two recent crimes that both happened at 10:30 in the morning. In one a customer withdrew a large sum of money at a Wells Fargo bank on the North Frwy and discovered he was being followed home. He drove at high speed and through red lights to evade the criminals but was robbed at gunpoint when he arrived at his apartment. The maintenance man was able to scare off the criminals. In the other a customer was approached by a panhandler while filling up with gas on Mangum. When a request for money was denied he then asked for a ride and pulled a gun when that too was refused. He then demanded the keys and the vehicle. The point here is to be aware of your surroundings and not become a victim. Crime does happen in the morning in broad daylight. If you are being followed do not drive home. Go to the nearest police station, fire station, or a business with a lot of people around. Whether putting gas in your car or shopping, go to stores with other people around or where there is an attendant. Leave immediately if you feel uncomfortable or see suspicious persons.

### **HOUSTON TRANSTAR** By Chuck Blesener

Created in 1996, the Houston Transtar consortium is a partnership between the City of Houston, Harris County, METRO, and TxDOT for providing Transportation Management and Emergency Management services to the Southeast Texas Region. Covering 13,000 square miles and 6 million people in Harris and 12 surrounding counties, they were the first, and now are one of only five such agencies in America. In 2011 they were responsible for handling 103,542 freeway traffic incidents, 1100 buses dispatched in peak hours, and 7.5 miles of light rail with 45,000 passengers.

They are currently expanding their Emergency Operations Center at 6922 Katy Road where 400-500 responders from 125 agencies work 24/7 to coordinate responses to natural and man-made disasters. Their services include the Traffic Operations Branch which directs the design and installation of new traffic signals with more than 2000 signals tied into a single management software program, the Motorist Assistance Program (M.A.P.) helps with minor vehicle problems within the unincorporated areas of Harris County and on the freeways, the SAFEclear traffic incident management program to clear stalled vehicles from highways within Houston, METRO Service Options for rail and bus service in Harris County, 190 large regional signs along freeways and HOV lanes to give you travel times, road delays, emergency evacuations, and amber alerts. They have installed over 900 closed circuit TV cameras along roadways in Houston and on highways as far away as Dallas, Luling, Brenham, and Giddings. Speed sensors have been embedded in the roadways on evacuation routes, including new award winning Blue Tooth sensors on 145 all the way to Dallas.

The website <u>www.houstontranstar.org</u> provides traffic updates and emergency news. The Virtual Earth Map allows you to to zoom in to view detailed information about state traffic in specific regions. For personalized emails or mobil messages and maps with travel times and traffic information, set up your free alerts at <u>mobile.houstontranstar.org</u>.


