

Nice Weather – Here Come the Scammers

Nice days bring spring cleaning and other projects and the scammers are taking advantage of it. There latest scam is to scope out homes having construction or other improvement projects done and show up posing as "inspectors" for the company that you had legitimately hired. Usually they will show up a day or two after your project is completed needing to "inspect" the work. Their whole purpose is to get you out of the house so they can occupy you outside while their cohorts burglarize your home. They are also posing as roof inspectors, cable company workers, and the old standby, tree trimmers.

Follow these simple rules:

- Never let anyone into your home or yard that you do not know.
- Never be lured out of your home.
- Keep your doors locked especially if you go outside.
- Legitimate employees of construction and utility companies will have an ID.
- If you are approached by anyone that seems suspicious, call the Constable immediately.

If you have an older neighbor, please alert them to these scammers. They often prey on our senior citizens. Have you paid your Constable Patrol dues? If not, why not? Send in your check or sign-up online today.

MORE TRASH FACTS

The Neighborhood Recyling/Drop-Off Center at 9003 North Main, one block north of Crosstimbers, accepts all recyclables (including glass). The site offers dumpsters for heavy trash, tree waste, furniture and some building materials. A driver's license and utility bill (proving residency) is all that is necessary to use the facility up to four times each month on Wednesday through Sunday, 10:00 a.m to 7:00 p.m. They do not accept garbage, dead animals, electronics, paint, hazardous liquids or toxic waste. At the same address is the City's Reuse Warehouse where you can donate surplus or reusable building materials, cabinets, paint, windows, doors and plumbing fixtures. Open Tuesday through Friday and the second and fourth Saturdays from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30p.m., dropping materials here supports local non-profits and saves landfill space.

The City has two Environmental Service Centers where hazardous materials and electronics can be taken. The North unit at 5614 Neches is open on the second Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and accepts batteries, aerosols, antifreeze, pool chemicals, telephone equipment, TVs, tires, paint, motor oil, lawn equipment, microwaves, fluorescent bulbs, fertilizer, fuel, electronic scrap, cooking oil, small appliances, styrofoam blocks, printers, and solvents. Residential electronic devices should not be placed in your black or green rolling bins or in curbside heavy trash collection. They can be taken to a variety of drop-off locations. Complete details are available at http://www.houstontx.gov/solidwaste/electronics recycling.html

STORM DRAIN AND REPAVING PROJECT

(Garden Oaks and Shepherd Park (Central) Paving and Drainage Project - WBS No.: M-000285-0001-4)

Estimated cost is \$19,658,776.00 with an estimated construction timeline from October 10, 2016 - July 07, 2018. This project includes construction of storm drainage improvements, concrete paving, curbs, sidewalks, driveways and underground utilities to address and reduce the risk of structural flooding. Improvements include modification of street conveyance and sheet flow, and provide detention as needed for mitigation in the areas of Shepherd Forest, Garden Oaks, Shepherd Park Plaza, Candlelight Plaza, and the Pinemont and Oak Grove areas

The construction route runs from Alba at Judiway north to Chamboard, then east to Brinkman, then north to Janisch at existing work on Pinemont project. Storm water on this project will travel south, but this project will tie into new storm drains on the new Pinemont project and serve as backup.

Construction on the project will affect storm sewers, waterlines, sanitary sewers, underground utilities, and paving along the route. Adjoining property owners will have issues with parking, driveway access, and garbage pickup. The contractor will be taking pictures and will attempt to restore most things to their original condition. Homeowners should take pictures of their working sprinkler systems, driveways, and landscaping. Some trees may have to be removed and others impacted by the construction. In most cases ditches will be removed and replaced with curb and gutters and sidewalks. Through a petition drive and negotiations with the City, the Garden Oaks neighborhood has some special arrangements for some areas of Alba through their neighborhood.

The contractor is JFT Construction and residents along the construction route will receive a door hanger with contact information on who to call for problems They should keep this information until all construction is completed.
