



Helpful Recycling Reminders from Solid Waste Management Meeting

We attended the recent Zoom presentation by Solid Waste Management Representative Alyce Coffey, for Community Outreach within Houston City Limits. Ms. Coffey has offered a number of suggestions to aid in effective recycling efforts. These are especially helpful in collection at this time, since she advises that about forty employees have been out sick and one employee has passed away with Covid-19. Therefore, there are less employees available to manage solid waste.

Number one to remember is that <u>large tree waste</u> is picked up on the 3^{rd} Thursday in the odd-numbered months and <u>junk</u> waste is picked up on the 3^{rd} Thursday in the even-numbered months. Note – Junk waste will not be picked up with tree waste.

Sometimes residents <u>mistakenly</u> put trash or garbage in the green recycle bin. Then the recycle employees have double work sorting out the recycle from the garbage. If the recycle material has been contaminated by the garbage, the whole bin contents will have to be dumped as garbage, which defeats everyone's effort to recycle.

Ms. Coffey gave us some important tips:

- 1. No old checkbooks in recycle. These should be shredded and placed in the bag in your <u>black</u> garbage bin.
- 2. All shredded material should go in the bag in your <u>black</u> garbage bin. (Shredded material is so small that when the sorters dump it on the sorting conveyor belt it blows off the belt and cannot be controlled/recycled).
- 3. No plastic bags of any kind should ever go in recycle bin.
- 4. Newspapers should go either loose or in paper bag in recycle bin.
- 5. Other items that should <u>NEVER</u> go in recycle: Helium tanks, clothes hangers of any kind, diapers, toys, chairs of any material, baskets, shoes, clothes, hoses, chains, grocery/store receipts (because they are treated with toxic chemicals which will contaminate the other paper recyclables).

Please always rinse out metal; green, brown, clear glass; and approved plastic containers so they do not wet other items or attract roaches. (You can imagine how awful it is to sort through roaches!)

Please flatten cardboard boxes so they are easier to handle.

Solid Waste Management is working on setting up an application for convenient access to questions and answers. They currently have an interesting and informative video available showing the operation of their recycling center. Remember, the more we recycle successfully, the more cost effective it becomes.



Ms. Coffey thanks us for our cooperation in handling our solid waste.

If you see <u>illegal dumping</u>, please report that to 311 to request service; be sure to record the reference number 311 provides so you can follow up. Also, please remember to report <u>illegal dumping</u> to our constable at 713-755-7628 because it is a <u>crime!</u>

Garden Club Tip of the Month

November can be a great time to add plants such as trees, shrubs, and rose bushes to your garden for the spring. This gives the plant's root systems more time to get established in the colder months, and ensure better survival in the spring and summer. All spring-blooming bulbs, such as crocus, anemones, freesia, ranunculus, and alliums also be planted now, as they need a period of cold to bloom. Wildflower seeds such as bluebonnets can also be planted now for best spring results.

Garden Club Monthly Local Highlight

Have you ever been a part of a CSA (Community-Supported Agriculture) or a Farm Share? CSAs connects consumers to local farmers by subscribing to the harvest of a local farm or group of farms. You receive your produce weekly and your Share is always local, fresh, and in season. There are several Farm Share options in the Houston area to choose from. One local program, Plant It Forward, empowers local refugees with agricultural backgrounds to develop sustainable farming businesses. The organization allows resettled refugees to utilize their crucial skill sets and provide healthy, fresh food to the community. Plant It Forward farmers also sell their produce around town at farmer's markets. You can learn more and sign for a Farm Share at www.plant-it-forward.org. There are several safe, socially distant pick-up locations around town and near SPP - or you can have

your produce delivered to your home.

Our October Yard of the Month goes to Marti Turner. Marti's yard is sunny, so she plants colorful narrow leaf and profusion zinnias, vinca, graffiti pentas, and coleus. Zinnias are a favorite in late summer and fall because they are drought tolerant and can re-seed each year. Background foliage includes daylilies, ferns, holly, and pittosporum while liriope lines the walkway.
