

MARK IT, PHOTOGRAPH IT, RECORD IT

Hi Neighbors,

If you use Facebook, you might have seen the Crime Alert that was posted on October 27th. It concerned a burglary in Garden Oaks. The stolen property was recovered by investigators from the Constable's Office.

Probably the most important line in the report was, "The complainant was able to provide the investigator with a description of his bicycle and tools, along with serial numbers." Here is a great lesson for all of us. If you have mowers, trimmers, bicycles, or anything of value, you should mark it. You can use your name or even better, your address. DO NOT USE YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER! Use permanent markers or an engraving tool. Take a picture of the item and if it has a serial number, record it. There are a multitude of free home inventory forms available on the internet where you can keep the information.

The holidays are upon us, and most of SPP will be decorating. Be sure to mark your decorations. It seems that thieves like to decorate their yards using your decorations. You can help deter the thieves, and if your item is stolen, possibly get it returned to you if it is marked.

We are blessed to have the Constable Patrol and the tenacious investigators that are a part of the excellent service we receive. If you have not paid your Constable fee for 2021, please do it now. HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

1. Keep live trees away from heat sources. Place your tree away from fireplaces and heaters.

2. Hydrate your tree. A dried-out tree can catch fire faster than one that has been properly watered.

3. Fake it! If you buy an artificial tree, make sure it's labeled "fire resistant."

4. Double-check your lights for safety. Replace any lights with frayed wires, broken sockets, and loose connections.

5. Power down before you turn in. Turn off all lights when you go to bed and before leaving the house.

6. Prevent electrical cord damage. Don't place lights in a way that might damage the cords, and avoid using nails or tacks. Use hooks instead.

7. Secure candles. Keep candles on a sturdy base to prevent tipping. Never leave a lit candle unattended.

8. Use unbreakable ornaments. If you have fragile ornaments, place them out of reach of pets and kids.



Garden Club Tip of the Month

Are you ready to protect your garden from a winter freeze? The cold temperatures reduce insect pest populations and allow plants to hibernate, which results in more robust spring plants. However, you'll want to be sure to protect your plants when the temperature drops - especially tender plants that cannot withstand temperatures below 32 degrees. Before a freeze, make sure your plants are adequately watered, and add mulch, pine needles, or leaves around trees, shrubs, and bulbs. Cover plants with a sheet or a frost blanket from a garden center, and move small potted or hanging plants inside. Wrap the trunks of tender trees, and be sure to harvest any mature fruit or vegetables before the freeze. You won't regret giving extra care to your plants during these cold winder months!

The Citizen Patrol Program is designed to provide a means for citizens to organize into patrol groups for the purpose of reducing crime in their community. Citizen Patrollers are the additional eyes and ears the police can count on to make Houston a safe place to live and work. The value of police/citizen cooperation is well illustrated by the success of the Citizen Patrol Program.
