2020 is a year none of us will forget. It has been a challenge to every family and each individual in Shepherd Park Plaza. We have weathered a pandemic, civil unrest, educational challenges, and much more.

We should all be very proud of the Deputy Constables assigned to patrol SPP. They have taken great risks to their personal safety to stay on the job through the Covid crisis. The Precinct One Constable's office was not untouched by the virus, but they managed to fulfill their obligations to us and others within the precinct. We have been blessed with fine officers and command staff.

Over the last year, our deputies have performed 4,728 contract checks, which works out to be about 91 checks per week! They had more than 600 vacation watch requests, responded to more than 100 calls regarding suspicious persons or vehicles, and conducted 170 park checks. Our Constable Program is one of the reasons we have one of the lowest crime rates in our area. Also, the deputies logged 32,521 miles during their patrols. This is the same distance as 8 1/2 round trips from Houston, TX to Portland, Maine!


