Winter Storm Uri - February 2021

SPPCC Garage Sale - Due to continued COVID-19 precautions, the Annual SPPCC Garage Sale has been postponed. The SPPCC recognizes that this event coordination is of eagerly anticipated neighborhood interest; however, at this time and for the overall health of our residents, the SPPCC prefers to postpone formal SPPCC led-coordination until further notice.

While the SPPCC is taking a step back from a formal Garage Sale event coordination, residents can coordinate and host their own garage sales. Consider pairing up with a neighbor for a multi-home sale or coordinating on your street for a common date. Check out Garage Sale tips online for how to prep, price, and host a successful garage sale. If you prefer not to conduct a garage sale, consider donating unwanted items to a local donation center. Depending on drop-offs, your donations may provide tax-deductible receipts.

In the Neighborhood

Loose Dogs - There have been quite a few posts on the SPP Facebook page about loose and/or stray dogs. As a general best practice and to help ensure the safety of both our residents and furry family members, please ensure that your pets are secure and backyards/gates do not have potential escape routes.

If you see loose dogs without an owner present, please be self-aware. If you feel comfortable, consider seeing if there is a collar/ID tag and assist with returning the dog home. If you feel uncomfortable or unsafe, consider contacting our Constable Dispatch (713-755-7628), Harris County Animal Services (281-999-3191), or 311 (or 713-837-0311). If you are being chased, Runner's World recommends these actions: 1) Stop running, 2) Talk in a loud firm voice, giving common command/stop words, and 3) Walk away slowly, backwards if necessary, to keep an eye on the animal, but try not to stare, as that can be perceived as a threat to the dog.

Introducing... Deputy William Purcell

Favorite part about SPP: *I enjoy the fact that the entire Shepherd Park Plaza subdivision looks out for one another. I have lost count of how many times I have responded to calls for service from concerned neighbors regarding suspicious activity near other people's homes. These calls clearly show that the residents are concerned about the safety and well-being of not only themselves, but for those around them.*

I can also boast that I have received full cooperation from residents regarding any criminal activity that has occurred or was about to occur in Shepherd Park Plaza. No one has ever been hesitant to provide surveillance video or eyewitness accounts of what they have seen or heard. This may sound trivial but not everyone is willing to cooperate with law enforcement when asked to provide statements that may lead to the arrest of a suspect involved in a crime. Shepherd Park Plaza residents believe in Precinct 1 and proudly expresses it with yard signage, police support decals, and even by simply going out of their way to greet me at my patrol unit in person to tell me how much they appreciate having me in the area. I have been told that it is known that deputies can't be everywhere at once and that our mere presence of just passing down the street provides a sense of security.

Constable Tip: *During my career in law enforcement, the vast majority of burglary of vehicle calls were committed on vehicles that were left unsecured overnight. It is common practice for criminals to pull on door handles while searching for an easy opportunity to enter a vehicle and take whatever they deem to be of value. Criminals who elect to live a life of crime try their very best to avoid getting caught. This is the reason they commit crimes during the dark of the night to avoid visibility and so you cannot provide a description of them if seen before they flee the area. They also avoid making a lot of noise which is why they do not shatter windows or unlock vehicles with criminal instruments to avoid activating car alarms and alerting you of their presence. Burglary of vehicles typically occur after midnight and before 4:00am when criminals believe the homeowners are in a deep sleep. In my professional opinion, I believe Shepherd Park Plaza is fully capable of having zero burglary of vehicles if all vehicles left outside were locked overnight and there was nothing of value left in plain view to tempt a criminal from making entry in the vehicle.*

Garden Club Tip of the Month

Don't commit "crape murder!" This term has been coined by horticulturists to describe severely cutting back crape myrtle trees, which is not the preferred way of handling these graceful and beautiful trees. It is not healthy for the trees in the long run, and cutting back crape myrtles creates large wounds that can serve as points of entry for fungal decay organisms. Pruning like this also shortens the life of the tree.

Crape myrtles should be pruned only if necessary, such as removing dead, weak, or damaged branches.

Using a combination of hydroponic and no-till soil cultivation methods, verdegreens produces healthy, nutritious, pesticide- and herbicide-free leafy greens, herbs, and mixed vegetables for our community. Our March yard of the month is Kelcie Berry. Kelcie's yard includes three mature live oaks. Since they shade the majority of the yard, they have been selective about choosing "shade lovers." Foxtail ferns, giant Liriope, ginger plants, azaleas, and pink Oleanders have made themselves at home. The front flower beds are a mix of pink, coral, and white nightshade begonias. To add a pop of color, they are planting brightly colored kalanchoes on the corner of the lawn as the centerpiece.



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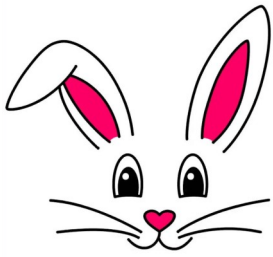

Families must RSVP online to pick a time slot to arrive.

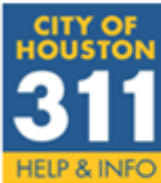
Starting **March 8**, Plaza Moms members will be able to sign up for a spot (check your email and Facebook page for invite).

Celebrate St. Patrick's day with these cool green recipes!

Leprechaun Lime Drink

- 1 quart lime sherbet, softened
- 1/2 cup thawed limeade concentrate
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 cans (12 ounces each) lemon-lime soda, chilled
- 1 to 2 cups crushed ice
- Lemon slices and lime peel strips, optional



In a large bowl, beat sherbet, limeade and sugar until blended. Stir in soda and ice. Serve in chilled glasses. If desired, top with lemon slices and lime peel.



Fluffy Key Lime Pie

- 1/4 cup boiling water
- 1 package (0.3 ounce) sugar-free lime gelatin
- 2 cartons (6 ounces each) Key lime yogurt
- 1 carton (8 ounces) frozen fat-free whipped topping, thawed
- 1 reduced-fat graham cracker crust (9 inches)

In a large bowl, add boiling water to gelatin; stir 2 minutes to completely dissolve. Whisk in yogurt. Fold in whipped topping. Pour into crust. Refrigerate, covered, until set, about 2 hours.
