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

The SPP Civic Club is kicking off our 2021/2022 year with another great event!


Come wave and support our Constables on a parade through the neighborhood.

2021-2022 Kickoff of Annual Membership & Constable Patrol Program Fundraising

Shepherd Park Plaza (SPP) is comprised of residents who generously volunteer their time and talents for the betterment of our community. It is through your annual membership dues that the SPP Civic Club can support the neighborhood through a wide range of services. Due to the financial diligence of the SPP Civic Club, we have been able to maintain our annual household membership dues at \$25/ year.

In addition, the SPP Civic Club oversees and administers the SPP and Candlelight Plaza (CP) Constable Patrol Program. This annual contract is through the Harris County Precinct 1 Contract Deputy Constable Program. To join in the Constable Patrol Program, we ask for an additional household contribution of \$295/ year.

Constable Patrol Program Highlights

Shepherd Park Plaza has been a participant in the Harris County Precinct 1 Contract Deputy Constable Program since 2000. Through this program, SPP has benefited from contracted constables patrolling the neighborhood, creating high visibility which helps in reducing crimes in the area. As deputies are specifically assigned to a contracted area, the program is known for rapid response to calls for service. Shepherd Park Plaza / Candlelight Plaza contract price split is 70/30 based upon count of homes in respective neighborhood

Your membership provides for <u>two uniformed deputies</u> patrolling our neighborhood in a <u>marked vehicle 80 hours per week</u>. This provides for a day and night shift patrol coverage! These dedicated officers consider SPP their own neighborhood and are resolved to keep SPP a safe place to live.

Positive Interaction Program (PIP) - North Division

Topic: Auto Dealers and Car Towing Awareness; Presentation by Sgt. Griffin

Auto sales/dealership businesses cannot be operated from your house or yard. All auto dealers must be licensed, with background checks performed on all staff. If you see such an operation, email HPD.AutoDealers@HoustonPolice.org to report or check on authenticity.

Car Towing Awareness

- 1. With consent: You call for tow
- 2. Without consent: Wrecker driver arbitrarily tows car away when parked, charges tow fee (potentially \$250+)

Warning! When out and about, make sure to park legally! Otherwise, your vehicle may be towed without your consent. For example, when eating at a restaurant and the primary parking lot is full, make sure where you park is legal and appropriate for the place of business.

If you do give consent to a tow, be aware of your rights. You have the right to request where you want your car towed (e.g., home or to a licensed repair or storage lot of your choice). However, you are responsible for the tow fee. The tow/wrecker driver cannot solicit for a repair shop to take it to. Make sure to read all documents and do not sign solicitation/work authorization paperwork. Always get a tow slip from the tow/wrecker driver and/or police officer. If in a wreck, make sure to file a report with the police.

You can also call 311 to request the "TOW AND GO" program, formally known as SAFECLEAR. TOW AND GO will also tow vehicles to a safe exit to change a flat tire. Find out more by visiting https://www.houstontx.gov/towandgo/

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

The menu at Millie's Kitchen & Cocktails has grown since the restaurant opened, and the quality is stellar! The seafood chowder was light and creamy, full of crab and lobster, and fresh corn was a perfect addition. The fried pickles were piping hot and perfectly seasoned. The mussels were delicious and reminiscent of the mussels served at Shepherd Park Draught House, so if you miss those, give these a try! The Grotto Combo was a perfect mix of shrimp, cod, and scallops if you can't decide on just one thing. We took the bartender's suggestion and asked for grilled scallops, which was a perfect preparation. We can't forget the cocktails. The Moscow mule and adult lemonade were both served icy cold and were refreshing on a hot Houston afternoon. Millie's uses the Roovy app for order and payment and is contactless from start to finish. 



GO / SPP (West) Project Aug 26, 2021 virtual meeting notes

Please leave all right-of-way markers in place.

WHAT TO EXPECT:

- Work will begin at Judiway Street, and proceed north.
- Notices will be hung on your door notifying of impending work and temporary work arrangements
- Potential impacts: Lane closures, reduced street parking, open excavations, close intersections for installation of culvert boxes. In support of installation of culvert boxes, water may be cut off for approx. 2 hours for each box installation. SPP culvert box size is 6x5 ft.
- Impacted areas will be restored; nothing will be improved above or beyond the contract specifications.
 - Project work will include repair of driveway from sidewalk to roadway.
 - Sidewalks will be replaced at the standard 5-foot width.
 - Broken or moved water meters will be replaced.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

- Stay informed by attending monthly online status meetings, sign up online at engagehouston.org for electronic notifications.
- Check the project map to see if your property will be impacted.
- Watch the process. If you have any questions, concerns or need to discuss any accommodations, contact Inspector Charles Jones or Contractor Maher Matta.
- Photo document your property before and after project for reference.
- Relocate any plants in the right-of-way area you want to save. If you have an irrigation system in the right-of-way area, make sure to inform the Project Manager, and rely on hose watering for your plants. If you have a special big tree in the right-of-way, talk to the Project Manager to see if assistance might be available.

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
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

Reminder about Heavy Trash: TREE waste is picked up in ODD months and JUNK waste in the EVEN months. TREE waste is defined as "clean" wood waste, such as tree limbs, branches, and stumps. Lumber, furniture, and treated wood will NOT be accepted as Tree Waste. JUNK is defined as items such as furniture, appliances, and other bulky material.
