Have fun selling and shopping!

A few helpful tips for a successful garage sale:

- Be visible from the street. Put a sign or balloons in your yard if you are holding your sale at the back of your driveway.
- Make items visible. Move some items to your driveway or toward the front of your house.
- Hang clothes instead of leaving them in boxes or folded on tables.
- Price some items. It's not necessary to price every single item but give shoppers an idea of what prices you expect so they aren't scared to ask.
- Save your used grocery sacks to bag up items shoppers buy.
- Have plenty of change and small denominations ready.
- Be prepared for early bird shoppers arriving at or before 8:00 a.m.
- Have a few inexpensive items so people feel like they've gotten a bargain.

Each home hosting a garage sale can place a sign in their yard and do other types of advertising. The SPPCC will have signs placed near the major entrances of SPP.

Curb Maintenance

Curb painting maintenance work for Section 2 has completed. For awareness, the SPPCC Board schedules curb painting maintenance on a 4-year rotation (1 section / year). Example: Section 1 in 2022, Section 2 in 2023, Section 3 in 2024, and Section 4 in 2025. High level details: Company doing the work is Curb Numbers, Etc. They will paint complete address number on both sides of driveway, resulting in 2 complete address number paintings / home; white background with 4" black numerals; glass beads applied to help night visibility. Please note that Curb Numbers, Etc. will not paint over custom curb numbers (ex. Texas flag design) without specific instructions to do so by homeowner.

Proposed Deed Restriction Amendment Frequency Asked Questions

What were the complaints raised regarding the short-term renters?

The complaints raised to the SPP Civic Club Board included, but were not limited to: loud music at all times of day and night, multiple visitors beyond original renters, trash thrown in yard and street, increased traffic, drug use, and indecent exposure.

What is the definition of a property owner and/or homeowner?

A property owner is the person holding record title to the property, or the person listed on the Deed of Trust to the property. This does not include renters or lease holders.

When were the Deed Restrictions last revised?

The SPP Deed Restrictions have not been revised since the original draft when the neighborhood was originally developed.

How do other nearby neighborhoods address similar concerns?

The vehicle for eliminating short-term rentals in the City of Houston is through a neighborhood's deed restrictions since there is no zoning or city ordinances governing this issue.

How will the prohibition of short-term rental be enforced?

A letter will be sent to the property owner explaining that the short-term rental of their home violates the terms of the Deed Restrictions and that they need to cease any further rentals within a specified period of time. If the property owner does not stop doing the short-term rentals, then the matter may be turned over to an attorney for further legal action.

How will this affect typical home leases and rentals of 30 days or greater?

Any home leases and rentals that do not fall within the definition of a short-term rental as defined in the amendment will not be impacted.

Are there any other proposed changes to the deed restrictions?

There are no other changes proposed to the Deed Restrictions.

Will there be a Civic Club meeting to discuss the amendment with SPP neighbors?

The survey results will determine appropriate next steps.

What has been the outcome of the research by the SPP Civic Club Board?

The SPP Civic Club Board engaged a full-service civil law firm whose practice specializes in community associations. This counsel has thoroughly reviewed all of the SPP Deed Restrictions and has provided legal guidance to assist in the interpretation of the Deed Restrictions, similar case law and outcome, as well as path forward options for prohibiting short-term rentals. In short, the mechanism to prohibit short-term rentals is to amend the SPP Deed Restrictions.

What are the next steps?

The SPP Civic Club Board has issued a survey to SPP residents, gauging support of the potential amendment. The survey was available until April 21, 2023. After the response time has closed, a summary of the results will be published in the SPP Pulse and on the SPP website. Individual resident information will not be published. After a review of the survey responses, if it is determined to move forward with the amendment to the Deed Restrictions, SPP residents will be informed of next steps.

Safe Driving Tips:

- Use patience (not aggression) and avoid engaging with angry drivers.
- To reduce stress, be prepared and organized before getting in driver's seat.

- Remember local roadways are NOT designed for speed!
- Approach intersections with care look in all directions.
- Aways scan roadway for objects or conditions in front of you.


